Sprayers save time and money

Approducers found significant water and chemical savings when spraying with a Martignani low volume tower sprayer. Farmers at Albys Farms and Koala Grape Producers trialled the Martignani low volume electrostatic B612 Whirhwind 1000 litre tower sprayer alongside their existing nebuliser sprayers for three months. With their existing of grapes with Gibberellic Acid at 1000 litres of water/acre, at three times 30 ppm on their Thompson seedless grapes.

grapes. Albys Farm tested the Martignani sprayer at 250 litre of water at three times 50 ppm/acre and 500 litre of water at three times

Soo litre of water at three times 50 ppm/acre. At 250 litre/acre, there was a 75 per cent water saving, a 56.4 per cent chemical saving and a grape sizing of 16-19 uniform and saleable fruit. With the 500 litre/acre, there was a 50 per cent water saving, a 17 per cent chemical saving and a grape sizing of 17-21. Koala Grape Producers tested at 250 litre of water/acre at three sprays at two different rates: three times 30 ppm and 120 ppm. Both trials had a 75 per cent of chemicals while grape sizing

cent of chemicals while grape sizing ranged from 16-18, and the second used equivalent chemicals and grapes sized from 17-21.

Both farms said the trialwas worthwhile and the fruit sprayed with the Martignani electrostatic low volume sprayer produced much cleaner fruit with far fewer black

cleaner fruit with fair fewer black spots and no disease.

The Martignani electrostatic low volume sprayer is a versatile spray unit, as shown in the past on other foliage, and has the ability to target the fruit or leaves as required by the individual operator to enhance crop growth or reduce disease.
